
UK participation in Horizon Europe

All 2024 (and subsequent) MSCA Work Programme calls will be covered by the UK's association to Horizon Europe, with applicants receiving their funding directly from the European Commission.

They will be able to participate <u>as beneficiaries</u> with the same rights and obligations as EU MS, including the possibility to coordinate consortia.

The MSC Actions

Consortia proposing doctoral programmes allowing fellows to move between countries and sectors to develop new skills, knowledge and collaborative networks	MSCA Doctoral Network	MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships	Fellowships for individuals moving between countries (within and outside of Europe). Can be used to strengthen existing/build new research teams
Consortia proposing a programme of secondments, based around a joint R&I project, allowing research and non- research staff to develop new skills, gain knowledge and extend networks of contacts	MSCA Staff Exchanges	MSCA COFUND (Doctoral and Postdoc Programmes)	Co-funding of regional, national and international programmes. Provides additional financial support for researcher training and career development programmes



Funding of the ' 'European Researchers' Night' to promote research activities to society.

MSCA COFUND

<u>Co-funding</u> of new or existing national, regional or international doctoral and postdoctoral programmes in any research area

- Single legal entity established in an EU MS / HE AC receives an EC <u>co-funding contribution</u> to set up their programme (free choice of topic) in any research area.
- Mono-beneficiary can include partners:
 - implementing partners to recruit, host and train the recruited fellows
 - Associated partners to deliver training and host secondments
- EC co-funding Contribution to the Programme
 - Maximum of €10M per beneficiary per call
 - Flexible use of co-funding depending on programme needs and the other co-funding sources, e.g.
 - Researcher costs (incl. salaries);
 - Training and research costs
 - Costs for managing the action...



MSCA COFUND – Myth Busting

COFUND projects need to be in a specific research area and/or with industry participation.

The mono-beneficiary applicant freely chooses the topic and partners of their doctoral or postdoctoral programme in any research area based on their programme's needs.

The applicant needs to provide a specific co-funding amount from their own funding

- **Co-funding can come from any source** as long as the funder agrees.
- **No specific amount required** contribution purely based on the project needs.

The applicant and their partners would need to provide money as co-funding

In-kind contributions (such as: supervision, facilities, training) from the applicant and/or partners can be monetized in the proposal and would count as a co-funding contribution.

The EU's Co-funding contribution needs to be used for specific purposes

This EC co-funding contribution can be used **flexibly** according to the project needs and what the other funding sources cover. Institutions are required to pay a minimum salary renumeration for recruited researchers.

MSCA and Citizens

Funding to implement the 'European Researchers' Night' as part of MSCA's public engagement activities to promote research activities to society.

- A single beneficiary or a consortium at regional, national or international level receives funding to plan and executive the 'European Researchers' Night'
- The European Researchers' Night takes part on the last Friday of September (and also the following day, if applicants wish).
- Event activities aim to make science accessible to the general public, by combining education and entertainment activities, e.g:
 - Exhibitions
 - Hands-on experiments
 - Science shows
 - Games and quizzes
 - Competitions
