





As of 1 January 2024, the United Kingdom becomes an associated country to Horizon Europe. Its researchers will be able to participate in this research and innovation programme of the EU on the same terms as researchers from other associated countries and will have access to Horizon Europe funding.

Today, the final step towards this was completed - the EU-UK Specialised Committee on Participation in Union Programmes adopted the <u>political agreement</u> on United Kingdom's association to Horizon Europe and to the Copernicus component of the Space Programme.

The UK's association to Horizon Europe will deepen the EU's relationship with the UK in research and innovation, bringing together research communities to tackle global challenges such as climate change, digital transformation and health

The association Protocol adopted by the Committee is an integral part of the <u>EU-UK Trade and Cooperation Agreement</u>
The UK will contribute around €2.43 billion per year on average to the EU budget for its participation in Horizon Europe, and roughly €154 million for participation to Copernicus.

Background

Horizon Europe is the EU's key funding programme for research and innovation with a budget of €95.5 billion for 2021-27. It tackles climate change, helps to achieve the UN's Sustainable Development Goals and boosts the EU's competitiveness and growth. The programme facilitates collaboration and strengthens the impact of research and

innovation in developing augmenting and implementing EU policine while tackling global shallonger

The association of the country will allow organisations and individuals to fully take part in the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions.



As of 1 January 2024, the United Kingdom becomes an associated country to Horizon Europe, including the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA).

Organisations based in the UK will be able to participate as beneficiaries in the same terms as those based in the European Union and countries already associated to Horizon Europe.


